# 1. Commission's management of the 2016/17 marketing year

- No vote on temporary measures following concerted action by CEFS and members.
- Price stagnant for third month in a row at 495 EUR/tonne for March 2017.

#### **Notifications I**

- Delegated Regulation in EU Council and Parliament.
   Publication: late June 2017. Entry into force: 1 October 2017.
- Outstanding issues (2 COM Working Docs still under discussion):
  - Publication of EU beet prices by EU region and/or MS
  - Inclusion of intra-firm & organic sugar sales in the EU white sugar price reporting scheme
- CEFS is drafting a guidance document for Member States



#### **Notifications II**

- No need to repeal articles & regulations that refer to quotas (e.g. 967/2006); obsolete from 1 Oct.
- 2017/18 sugar may be marketed before 1 Oct 2017.
- 2017/18 sugar may not be used to fulfil export licences from March 2017.
- 2017/18 sugar may not be exported without export licences before 1 October 2017.

## **TRQ Management**

- No practical changes:
  - Concerns on proof of refining resolved.
  - "Declaration of independence" will not apply to importers of sugar thanks to coordinated action with ASSUC.
- Regulation 891/2009 will continue to apply until legislation enters into force.



## Additional import duties

- The additional duties to be applied when the special safeguard clause (SSC) for sugar is triggered.
- To be incorporated into horizontal legislation; discussions at an early stage.
- SSC currently suspended
  - → CEFS letter to COM: suspension of SSC should be allowed to lapse from 1 October 2017.



## 3. Sugar Market Observatory



#### Sugar Market Observatory (SMO)

- Announced by COM in March 2017.
- CEFS has nominated two experts to the Economic Board of the SMO:
  - Markus Neundörfer, Südzucker
  - Stanislas Bouchard, Cristal Union
- CEFS Director General Marie-Christine Ribera to be observer.

# CEFS' positions on the CAP post-2020

 CEFS position & response to public consultation circulated on 5 May 2017.

#### 5 priority areas:

- 1. Preserving the relationship between farmers and processors
- 2. Rapid and objective crisis response
- 3. More balanced market transparency
- 4. More help for farmers, where there is added value
- 5. Direct payments



### **Omnibus Regulation**

- Both EU Council & Parliament now have positions on agri.
- Trilogues could start in July 2017; plenary vote in late 2017 ready for entry into force on 1 January 2018.
- Concerns:
  - Sectorial income stabilisation tool based on indices.
  - Provisions on producer cooperation that could disturb the regulatory balance in the sugar sector.
  - Annual revision of voluntary coupled support amounts.
